Projects KIKS Celebrates July 4, 2020, Liberia, West Africa

Under the leadership of Country Director Sekou Fofana and Outreach Director Mafata Dukuly and Volunteers, Makula Kabbah, Patrick Jeffrey III and Winston T. Jackson, history was made.

The group made an eight hour road trip from Monrovia, Liberia to our ancestral homelands, two remote villages, Madina Town and Nikebozu Town, Lofa County. Their mission was multi-faceted.



Liberia was founded by free American slaves, on January 7, 1822. Joseph Jenkins Roberts was the first elected Black President, in 1848. He was a US citizen, born in Norfolk, Virginia. On this historic day, July 26, 2020, Project KIKS celebrates 173 years of Freedom & Independence from the American Colonization Society. Project KIKS donates a bag rice rations to the Institution for the Blind, Monrovia as part of our Water And Rice (WAR) initiative.
